Gun Found During Vehicle Search Warrant

In July, 2016 police responded to a report of a male attempting to pass fake \$100 bills at the Haggan Food Store. The associated male was stopped in a vehicle on State Route 532 a short time later. The vehicle was impounded and searched after a warrant was obtained. Suspected methamphetamine, fake \$100 bills, various pieces of mail from Camano Island and the north county area, access cards and identification that did not belong to the suspect and a semi-automatic pistol were found inside the vehicle. The gun's original purchaser was recently identified through ATF (Alcohol Tobacco and Firearms) records. Charges of possession of stolen property and forgery will be referred to the Prosecutor's Office. Investigation related to the potential stolen firearm continues.



Haggen Shoplift Suspects

Caught On Camera

On 09-04-16 at about 11:00 pm police responded to a theft complaint at the Haggen Food Store. Surveillance video was obtained and showed two males in the store spending time in the alcohol section. One male appeared to be acting as a lookout while the other male grabbed bottles of alcohol and ran from the store. An employee confronted the remaining male and asked customers to detain him. While the customers were blocking the exit, the male that fled with the alcohol returned to the store and shoved one of the customers, allowing the remaining male to escape. One subject has been identified with help from the public and admitted to the crimes of assault and theft during an interview. Charges of theft and assault have been referred to the Prosecutor's Office.

WSP Lab Identifies Burglary Suspect

On 10-13-16 a report was received from the Washington State Patrol Lab reference latent finger prints that were submitted earlier this year. The finger prints were obtained from the point of entry (window) at a business that was burglarized in January, 2016. A suspect was identified from the prints. When the suspect is located an interview will be attempted.



Incriminating Information Found on Cell Phone




On 05-07-16 a female driving a blue Jeep rolled through a stop sign at 271 Street NW and Pioneer Highway. The Jeep struck a male on a motorcycle, knocking him to the ground. The female failed to provide any information to the victim prior to fleeing the scene. The female driver was identified and a search warrant was obtained for her cell phone. The Sheriff's Office Computer Forensics Unit finished processing the cell phone on 10-06-16. A review of the information obtained from the cell phone revealed incriminating statements and web searches reference the hit and run collision. The case has been referred to the Prosecutor's Office for review.

Employee Theft at the Stanwood Senior Center

A male employed as a driver at the Stanwood Senior Center was terminated on 06-03-16. The male failed to return his company issued credit card, cell phone and fax machine. The Stanwood Senior Center accounting department later discovered that the male employee had made numerous unauthorized purchases using the company credit card, totaling more than \$900.00. The male did not respond to detective attempts to contact him. Relatives report that he is currently living at an unknown address in Utah. The charge of Theft Second Degree has been referred to the Prosecutor's Office.

Focus on Offenders

Stanwood Police have noticed an increase in vehicle prowls after a known offender was recently released from jail. I will be working with patrol officers over the next several months to identify the offenders who are responsible for the majority of the crime occurring in City of Stanwood. The Prosecutor's Office will be made aware of the individuals we are focusing on and all viable cases associated with these individuals will be referred for charging.
