City density per square mile is 1,967 with 1,050 persons living in the designated flood plain area.

Trends:

Beginning January 2015 a fifth column will be added to the Compstat Report which will include year to date comparisons between 2014 and 2015. This will help to identify crime trends from year to year. This last year there was an increase of approximately 20 additional thefts during 2014 as compared to 2013. Vehicle thefts and assaults are down. We had 4 robberies compared to 2 in 2013. Three of the four robberies have been solved.

Calls for service are up by 2,089. Calls for service include self-initiated events. Swing and night patrols have been more active working special projects throughout the city to include business checks, which has increased self-initiated calls for service.

Stanwood patrols will continue to work at reducing collisions on State Route 532 through education and enforcement. Each month this report will continue to provide a collision report identifying all collisions that occur within the city to include locations and causes.



Detective Report – December 2014


The case involving the pawned tools in which the victim reported to police several of her tools had been taken while she was away at a Sea Hawks game. The victim's daughter who was in rehab at the time the case was assigned to me acted as a witness for the state, in which she implicated one of her friend's associates; claiming he had stolen the tools from the garage then pawned them. Based on the investigation and in talking with the actual person accused and generally accepted suspect in this case the following was determined. The suspect was able to provide the identity of one other witness previously only known by first name. This secondary witness was able to provide physical evidence contradicting the daughter's statement. The conclusion of the investigation showed the daughter was actually the person whom had orchestrated the entire scheme in order to facilitate her drug habit prior to entering into drug rehab. Once this information came to light the victim in the case declined to be willing to prosecute the case. The stolen items which had been seized from the pawn shop were returned to the pawn store so the victim could pick them up at a later date.

Another case involving the theft of more than 24,000 dollars in musical instruments over the course of 6 months was assigned to me for follow up. In working with the victim in this case several suspects have been developed and identified associated with the stolen instruments. Several of the instruments have been recovered and PC is being developed on four of the suspects. I will keep you posted on the progress.
