State Route 532 Traffic Emphasis

The SR 532 Traffic Emphasis Project was implemented in June. Collision data collected from state and local records showing the numbers, locations and times of traffic collisions along SR 532 through Stanwood shows the main cause for these traffic collisions is a result of distracted drivers and/or following too closely. The goal of this project is to reduce the number of traffic collisions through Education, Enforcement and Signage.

Over the past few weeks Stanwood Police has conducted an emphasis with the main goal of educating the public about distracted driving. Police focused their efforts on stopping those using cell phones while driving. Warnings were given in June with enforcement to follow in July.



Detective Report – June 2014


This month I have been working on several cases, most noticeably a robbery which occurred in Stanwood in the Viking Village business complex. The case has been solved in part due to the outstanding group effort by everyone involved, particularly Deputy Malaby's individual efforts in searching for then locating the stolen vehicle shortly after the occurrence of the robbery. Not only was the vehicle recovered but Malaby identified the primary suspect in this case; who was in possession of the vehicle's keys. There are obviously several other details about this case which I would enjoy sharing but since this is an active case about to be referred to the Prosecutor's Office I am providing a minimal amount of information in this format.

The burglary of the Port Susan Middle School has also been solved. Two individuals entered the school breaking one of the ground floor windows using a wooden pallet. Police responded quickly and were able to detain one of the individuals who were seen running from the school after Police arrived. The other suspect in this case was not located. However he was later identified located and questioned. Although he did not confess to the crime, enough information has been gathered to establish PC for his arrest.
